The Wagon Road Park-and-Ride station is a quarter-mile walk to the east of the new facility. This station is the major RTD hub in the area, and will eventually include shuttle service from the termination point of the light rail line (approximately 124th Avenue and Grant Street). There are also bus routes that run along Huron Street (to the east), along Pecos Street (to the west), and along 120th Avenue (to the north).

Recommendations when Applying for Public Assistance

The Arc of Adams County staff recommends the following process in applying for benefits:

- Obtain needed information regarding your personal information including address, phone number, Social Security number, Medicaid or other insurance information. If you have a case number already, please have that ready.
- Obtain income and expenses information and have them ready.
- Apply online or in person. Wait times for in person applications are long.
- Stay in contact with Human Services and your case manager for needed follow up or recertification. If you apply online, please call within 30 days to follow up on your application.

Help from the Arc of Adams County

The Arc of Adams County staff will discuss with you during intake what steps you can do on your own and what steps you will need to have other people help you with. We encourage your current supports in place to help you with this process. If you have no one else to help you we will discuss what you will need to do and what we can help you with. The Arc of Adams County cannot take the lead on your application process.
